### WHO AM I?

Ok, let me introduce myself.: I am *Charadrius alexandrinus*. aka *Charlie* the Kentish Ployer for friends.



I am a **small bird**, no more than 6.70 inches and about 17 wings-spread.

I am very fast, and I am very nervous when I'm hungry. I love eating little insects, worms and some small mollusks I find along the seaside.



The feathers of my chest and stomach are white, and they're brown at my back. I've got dark spots in my forehead and around my eyes. It is a kind of mask I use. My legs are dark, long and thin. And my beak is black, short and narrow.

#### WHERE DO I LIVE?

I love water, that's why I live near **beaches** and **wetlands**.

In the **last 10 years** my people has **decreased** almost a **70% in Spain**. We are **only 6000 couples left**.

I'm very **shy** so my partner and me have our **nest** on our **own** or with other few couples near us, in **small groups**.



We nest in sandy, open areas and free of vegetation; it is very risky, but this is our habit. The eggs of our brood are light brown and dark spotted. They are usually 3 of them and my partner and me hatch them for over 24 to 27 days.



# SHOULD I TELL YOU MY PROBLEM?

Ok. Now that you know a little about my life let me tell you that we are suffering some problems from a few years ago.



Our breeding season is from April to August, and you all know that our beaches are very crowded at this time of the year. Many of our eggs are (accidentally) destroyed by humans, and sometimes even other animals (cats and dogs) destroy our nests.



Another problem is when the machines clean the seashore, they leave it very clean but at the same time they sometimes obliterate our nests too. What a pity!

Fortunately, we have some small hideouts: Natural Parks. In those places we feel protected and safe, although there are people who don't respect the rules. They are dangerous.
